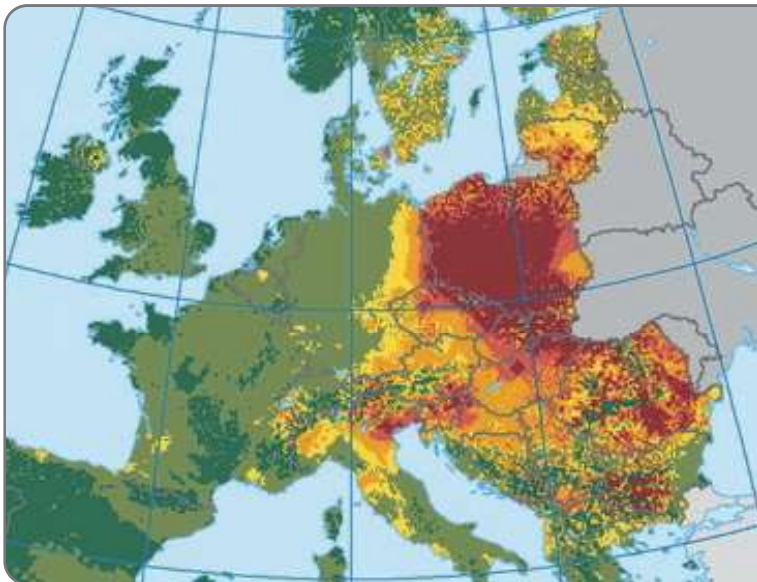

Air pollution

key reason
for programme
establishment



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Single family buildings

major source
of air pollution



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Single family buildings

There are **5.5 million** single family buidlings
>**70%** use solid fuels for heating (coal and wood)
c.a. **3 million boilers** must be replaced in comming years



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Financing support
for households
is crucial but not
sufficient to achieve
the objective – clean air

**Regulations - the major
driver for change**

Product regulations – emission standard for heating appliances, fuel standards
Regulations imposed directly on household

Emission standards – coal and biomass boilers



Previously 150-200 thousand boilers (no emission standards) sold to Polish households

**Emission standards
for new boilers
introduced in 2017**



Quality standards for coal

Until 2018
lack of quality
standards for coal
