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

Co-operation between authorities

Co-operation with other regulators:

- 80% other Competent Authorities
- 90% with Police
- 80% with Customs
- 40% with Prosecutor
- 30% Port/train operator
- 20% Other

- 65% have intelligence capacity
- 80% use risk assessment

Customs:

- ▶ 65% work with customs to create inspections plans
- 44% say waste is high on customs priority list




Both Vietnam and Malaysia have introduced import restrictions in response to the increased volumes of waste entering the countries in the months since China's ban on 24 grades of solid waste – casting further doubt on the ability of other South-East Asian economies to absorb China's lost capacity.


Last week, Vietnamese Prime Minister Nguyen Xuan Phuc announced that the country would not be issuing any new import licenses. Vietnam is set to follow up its new restrictions with a crackdown on smuggled waste as more than 6,000 containers of paper, plastic and metal scrap remain in limbo at Vietnamese customs points awaiting processing, according to reporting by *Reuters*.

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




Exchanges

Officers have learned how:

- to involve neighbouring countries and other national regulators in inspections
- different types of waste should be assessed
- enforcement can be structured
- to prioritise waste streams
- to inspect upstream waste sites and compare sampling procedures
- health and safety procedures: how to open containers safely and analyse for fumigants

2022 Plans: Austria, The Netherlands and Germany

COVID-19



- Exchanges and 'in person' training postponed
- Switch to 'incident mode' waste streams affected
 - Rapid reporting to Governments, EU, inter-agency meetings
 - Enforcement positions adopted
- Closure of ports and offices
- Stockpiling
- Clinical waste increased (and transboundary movement becomes difficult)
- Prioritised clinical waste notifications
- 'Fake news' to make authorities loosen controls
- Potential for illegal operators to capitalise on a reduced enforcement presence
- Increase in illegal waste shipments due to a decrease in domestic waste capacity and disruption to global supply chains










Violations found by country



Destination countries






Effect of China's 2018 import restrictions on plastic shipments






Current plastics movements




In field tools

- Currently over 100 users
- Quicker and easier than current process

Collect, report and store inspection data online either in field or office



Take photos and add them to inspection form



Can also bulk upload inspections



Flagging system to other authorities



Directly feeding certain data into other systems via API-file (e.g. Spotfire)



Available for intelligence analysis if authority agrees








Inspection focus in 2020:

- 35% focused on plastics for inspections in 2020.
 - Medical waste (due to COVID), WEEE, batteries, tyres, mixed municipal waste
- Why focus on these issues? Intelligence, risk assessments, results from previous inspections


Impacts of COVID-19 pandemic:

- 65% said their inspections last year were impacted by COVID (most did fewer inspections, many didn't do inspections for months, some only performed desktop inspections)
- Points of interest from inspections in 2020: Mixed municipal waste declared as secondhand toys, plastic waste declared as product, fewer issues with cross-border dumping of construction waste due to COVID shutting down the industry
- Many court cases postponed
