Market Assessment and Policy Analysis of Eco-innovation Landscape in the Republic of Moldova

Background

SMEs play a crucial role in the EU's Eastern Partnership (EaP) countries' economies, and their collective environmental footprint often exceeds that of large enterprises. To mitigate their socio-environmental impact, while also improving SMEs' competitiveness and resilience to risk, the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) and the European Union (EU) have been supporting SMEs across the globe in the development and application of "eco-innovation" - a business model that incorporates sustainability and life cycle thinking throughout all business operations and value chain partners. Eco-innovation entails a coordinated set of modifications or novel solutions to products (goods / services), processes, market approach and overall organizational structure of a company.

As part of the EU-funded EU4Environment programme, UNEP, the EU, and the Organization for Small and Medium Enterprises Sector Development (ODIMM) will be assisting SMEs in the Republic of Moldova to develop new business strategies/models that are aligned with the eco-innovation approach. In collaboration with the individual expert, UNEP and ODIMM have carried out a market assessment and policy instrument analysis of the eco-innovation landscape in the Republic of Moldova. The report aims to identify priority sectors for further engagement with the SMEs in the country. Based on the analysis of different public documents and reports, two sectors were identified as most promising to upscale eco-innovation measures among SMEs: a) Agriculture b) Industry. Therefore, following the market-level analysis template of UNEP's Eco-innovation Manual was identified a market in each of the two sectors: Wine production market and Apparel market. The report also shows that there are already existing regulations as well as upcoming reforms that will encourage eco-innovative approaches in these sectors.

The aim of this working meeting is to consult the findings of the report among key governmental agencies in the Republic of Moldova. Based on their feedback and recommendations, the report will be validated and finalised. It will then form the basis for UNEP's and ODIMM's further engagement with Moldovan SMEs in assisting them to develop new business strategies/models that are aligned with the eco-innovation approach.

Meeting objectives

- Gather relevant governmental agencies to discuss the findings of the draft eco-innovation market assessment and policy analysis, and to collect their feedback/suggestions; and
- Inform participants about the next steps that UNEP and the ODIMM will undertake under the EU4Environment programme to assist Moldovan SMEs to develop eco-innovation business strategies/models.

The meeting will gather the following participants: State secretaries of Ministry of Economy, Ministry of Environment, Ministry of Agriculture and Food Industry, representatives of governmental agencies, environmental and ecological NGOs, Delegation of the EU in RM, representatives of Implementing Partners (ODIMM, UNEP, UNIDO), Business Associations, Business incubators.
