#### Background

In 2014, Georgia signed an Association Agreement with the European Union (EU). One of the articles of the Association Agreement refers to a need for introducing Sustainable Public Procurement (hereinafter - SPP) principles. SPP is considered the process by which public authorities seek to achieve the appropriate balance between three pillars of sustainable development - economic, social, and environmental - when procuring goods, services, or works at all stages of the project. Since the SPP concept is a completely new approach to Georgian legislation, there was a need for a full roll-out of the SPP approach, including policy development, capacity building and SPP implementation, in Georgia for the uptake of SPP by the government.

United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) is one of the five partner agencies implementing a newly launched EU-funded EU4 Environment (2019-2022) Action. This regional programme supports 6 countries, including Georgia, in making policy planning and investment greener, stimulating the uptake of innovative products and technologies, and raising awareness about the benefits of environmental action. More specifically, within EU4Environment's component on "circular economy and new growth opportunities", UNEP supports Georgia to promote activities related to SPP issues and its complementary tools.

UNEP in close cooperation with the Environmental Information and Education Centre (EIEC) and the State Procurement Agency of Georgia (SPA) implements a set of activities on promotion and application of SPP, including improving the legislation to introduce the SPP provisions, as well as to raise awareness on the SPP benefits. In the framework of the EU4Environment project, a training session for the business sector, including Small and medium enterprises (SMEs) and business associations is envisaged in order to build capacity of business to respond to public tenders.

#### Objectives of the training session

- Raise awareness of the Georgian business associations, small and medium enterprises (SMEs) on SPP approach;
- Introduce benefits of SPP to Georgian business associations, SMEs (including producers, distributors, suppliers etc.);
- Present SPP criteria, elaborated for selected products (such as imaging equipments, printers, plotters, cleaning products);
- Present examples of SPP practices in the EU countries;
- Discuss with the SMEs' representatives on the key challenges and possibilities to respond to the public tenders with inclusive sustainability criteria.

#### **Participants**

The representatives of the Georgian business associations, including from the European Business Association Georgia (EBA), Infrastructure Construction Companies Association/ICCA, Georgian Manufacturers Association, Georgian Employers Association, Office of the Business Ombudsman of Georgia will be invited to the training session. The representatives of SMEs will be invited through these business associations.

The training session will be held in a hybrid format (in person and online via the Zoom platform).

The products (imaging equipment, printers, plotters, and cleaning products) that were initially prioritised for SPP pilot tenders in Georgia will be used for this exercise. Taking into consideration newly developed draft SPP regulations, SPP criteria elaborated for selected products (such as imaging equipments, printers, plotters, cleaning products) and international best practice examples, trainees will be assigned to foresee and practice SPP criteria at different stages of the procurement process.
