

Recommendations

- Address the low number of inspections
- Shorten an inspection's time on site and the length of inspection reports
- Ensure flexibility of the risk assessment methodology
- Establish an alert tracking mechanism
- Identify the needed number of environmental monitoring stations and improve groundwater monitoring
- Optimise the processing, use and dissemination of primary environmental data

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- Encourage companies to **submit required continuous self-monitoring** reports on time
- Expand 24/7 responses to serious incidents
- Establish a Pollutant Release and Transfer Register (PRTR)
