Meeting objectives

- To present the findings from each of the RECP in-plant assessment reports
- To summarize the general outcomes and experiences from the RECP assessments
- To conclude the RECP Demonstration Project in the Republic of Moldova with ways forward for both the RECP trainees and the assessed companies

This training session shall include both presentations as well as discussions and feedback on the strategies needed to communicate, present, and critically examine the RECP assessment outcomes in order to facilitate the next steps needed by the management of each RECP Demonstration Company. This is an important approach as the management's acceptance or rejection of the RECP proposal depends, to some degree, on the level of professionalism, knowledge, and delivery of findings for the identified RECP measures.

This training session also represents the final part of the RECP learning process in the country. Here, the RECP trainees will get the opportunity to learn from the experience of others and exchange views.

Background

The RECP training is an activity part of the RECP Demonstration Project led by UNIDO under EU4Environment. It aims to provide hands-on experience and advanced training on the application of the RECP methodology to professional trainees and company staff. It also aims to demonstrate the benefits and opportunities brought forth by RECP in the selected industries.

The training covers both theory and practice. It presents the principles of [RECP as a set of preventive environmental strategies](#) for processes, products, and services to increase efficiency and reduce risks to humans and the environment. At the same time, these measures have the potential to reduce the consumption of materials and energy, reducing thus, production costs. Within the Demonstration Project, the participants learn step by step to analyse production processes, identify sources of waste and emissions, understand the root causes of losses, and develop organisational and technical measures for improvement.
