- EU-funded action: 20.05 million EUR for 5 Eastern Partnership (EaP) countries: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine
- 4 (5)-year programme, started in January 2019
- 5 implementing international organisations: OECD, UNEP, UNIDO, UNECE and World Bank
- Legal basis: Commission Implementing Decision C(2017)7963, and the EU "20 Deliverables for 2020"
- Emphasis on environmental action that benefits citizens and is visible
- Building on past successes and continued support to reforms (e.g. under EU-funded EaP GREEN and FLEG programmes)
- **Co-ordination with other EU4... programmes** (EU4Business, EU4Energy, EU4Climate)
- Current status: **implementation phase** (national and regional workplans finalised)

SPP

- Developed legal provisions aim to ensure implementation of SPP in each stage of the public procurement cycle; draft bylaw on SPP
- Prioritization, market readiness analysis and sustainability criteria for: i) toner cartridges; ii) ink cartridges; iii) printers and plotters; iv) cleaning and polishing products
- Training materials and training workshop (5 national; 3 regional

Eco-labelling

- Assessment of existing eco-labelling system (regional eco-labels, etiquette, BioProduction/organic)
- Awareness raising of civil servants, private sector representatives, wide public on the concept of eco-labelling, it's benefits and challenges

SPP

- The Governmental Decree will aim to encourage and, in some cases, even impose application of SPP criteria by contracting authorities
- Market review and sustainability criteria for 3 new and 2 previously prioritized products (i.e. energy efficiency products, organic products, window frames)

- Consultations with the EU Ecolabel (EU Flower) team
- Alignment of the Regulation (EC) No 66/2010 of the European
 Parliament and of the Council of 25 November 2009 on EU Ecolabel
- Public hearings and stakeholders' consultations
- National eco-label designed

SPP

- Sustainability criteria, methodological recommendations for i) repair and construction of roads; ii) food and food services
- Fields for voluntary sustainability crietria inserted into Prozorro eprocurement system

Eco-labelling

- Eco-labelling standards for life cycle assessment i) furniture, flooring materials and other timber products and ii) polymer products

Way forward in AZERBAIJAN



Assessment of the policy, legal, regulatory and institutional gaps for inserting sustainability criteria in the procurement process and provide recommendations on how to address them:

- Status assessment: strategies, policy documents and institutional framework; identify policy and institutional gaps and recommendations; priority products and market readiness assessment
- Legal review: legal and regulatory framework; recommendations on improvement of the legislation

Assessment on **eco-labelling system** and recommendations on improvement and promotion of eco-labelling in Azerbaijan:

- Eco-labelling system and availability of international labels in the market
- Legal review: how eco-labelling related texts are captured in national legislation
