Benefits of SEA

- Provides for a high level of environmental and health protection: ensures that environmental and health implications of strategic decisions are considered and addressed before decisions are taken
- Promotes a wide range of sustainability priorities and issues (climate change, energy transition, etc.) and this contributes to *achieving SDGs*
- Reduces risks by providing 'early warning' and thus *increases stability of investments and streamlines economic development* and green growth (SEA also required by the IFIs)
- Saves time and costs: helps to prevent costly mistakes and reduced the timeframes for project approval

Benefits of SEA (cont'd)

- Increases the efficiency of decision-making and strengthens governance by making planning and decisionmaking more participatory and transparent
- Addresses potential conflicts between various economic sectors
- Enhances transboundary cooperation
- Helps bring nature back to cities and towns

SEA trainings delivered by June 2023

- Ukraine: 2 trainings (2023) 400+ participants each
- Republic of Moldova: 1 training (2023) 70+ participants
- Georgia: 2 trainings (2019) and 1 training* (2022) 129 participants
- Azerbaijan: 2 trainings (2021) 71 participants
- Armenia: 1 training* (2022) 37 participants
- Regional training for all EaP countries (2020) 52 participants

* Means training was a part of another capacity-building activity
