Background

In accordance with the provisions of article 34 (subsection 9) of the Regulation on the planning, elaboration, approval, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of public policy documents (Governmental Decision no. 386/2020), the Ministry of Environment of the Republic of Moldova, in partnership with the Ministry of Economic Development and Digitalization and the EU-funded EU4Environment programme, is conducting public consultations on the draft Programme for the promotion of Green economy for the period 2023-2027 in Moldova.

The programme is a medium-term public policy document (5 years), which derives from the National Development Strategy "European Moldova 2030", the draft Environmental Strategy 2030, the objectives of the European Green Deal and the achievements of the Programme on the promotion of Green Economy in the Republic of Moldova for the years 2018-2020 and associated Action Plan. The development of the Programme is coordinated by the Interministerial Working Group for the promotion of the green and circular economy.

The development of the Programme and the activities of the Working Group are supported by the EU-funded EU4Environment Green Economy programme, as part of its component on "Promoting green economy, policy coherence and cross-sectoral coordination", which is implemented by the UN Environment Programme (UNEP).
