Background

The year 2023 was nominated the “Year of Skills” by the European Commission. This initiative will give a fresh impetus to lifelong learning, empowering people and companies to contribute to the green and digital transitions, supporting innovation and competitiveness.

Having a workforce with the skills that are in demand contributes to sustainable growth, leads to more innovation and improves companies' competitiveness. The European Year of Skills 2023 will help companies, in particular, small and medium enterprises, to address skills shortages. It will promote a mindset of reskilling and upskilling, helping people to get the right skills for quality jobs. The green and digital transitions are opening new opportunities for people and the EU economy.¹

The 2023 EU Green Week, in the framework of the European Year of Skills, aims to create a new momentum to reach the EU 2030 social targets of at least 60% of adults in training every year, and at least 78% in employment. To contribute to these ambitious targets, the EU4Environment implementing partners were called to focus this year on skills for sustainable, resilient, and socially fair communities.

Since 2019, EU4Environment has been supporting the civil servants, experts, businesses from the Eastern Partnership (EaP) countries to boost their awareness, knowledge and build skills on green economy through a variety of targeted trainings and regional knowledge sharing. We are proud that the Programme already reached more than 4 million people and trained about 3 K stakeholders throughout the region.

Meeting Objectives and Description

The EU4Environment event within the 2023 EU Green Week will demonstrate how EU4Environment has contributed to enhancing skills of stakeholders in the region. It will also present in detail professional courses and trainings developed within the Programme, their results, and remaining challenges.

A distinguished panel of speakers from Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Moldova, and Ukraine will intervene to present courses and training programmes.
