Cleaning Services and Materials

Georgia has been introducing sustainable public procurement (SPP) since 2019. Cleaning materials,

including cleaning products (all-purpose cleaners, sanitary cleaners, hand soaps, etc.), cleaning accessories (cloths, mop heads, tissue paper, etc.) and cleaning equipment (e.g. vacuum cleaners), is one of the **product groups prioritized for SPP**

implementation.¹

What are the possible environmental, social and economic benefits of procuring sustainable cleaning services and materials⁴



- Improved environmental and social performance, by ensuring fair working conditions and helping Georgia transition to a green economy.
- 2 Reduced risk to human health from exposure to dangerous substances (e.g. solvents).
- 3 Reduced wastewater from the production and use of cleaning materials.
- 4 Reduced electricity use, e.g. by using energy-efficient cleaning equipment such as vacuum cleaners.
- **5** Preserved natural resources, e.g. from using biodegradable or solvent-free products.
- **6** Reduced solid waste and end-of-life costs, e.g. by reductions in packaging; ensuring availability of refill packs.
