Highlights of the achievements with EU4Environment support

- ✓ Law on Public Procurement integrates now sustainability and social provisions. By-laws on sustainable purchasing criteria for printing and cleaning products drafted (UNEP)
- ✓ **Guidelines on EIA of the Hydropower Projects** developed to provide sector-specific guidance in support of Georgia's Environmental Assessment Code (UNECE)
- ✓ Nearly EUR 2 mln is the amount of potential annual savings by 30 SMEs, applying the RECP measures (UNIDO)
- ✓ **Digital support to RECP institutionalization**: over 40 participants (63% women) from the RECP Clubs & demonstration companies tested the **I-GO Assistant tool** for SMEs at information workshop in March 2023 (UNIDO)
- ✓ Greening debt capital markets and the role of green bonds analyzed to support financing of long-term green investments (OECD)
- ✓ **Green public investment programme** designed to utilize non-municipal organic waste generated by agriculture, households, food and beverage production. It will help to process biodegradable waste that is currently disposed in landfills, illegally burned, or dumped in nature (OECD)
- ✓ Guidelines for sustainable management of forest areas within Emerald sites in line with the Bern Convention are underway (World Bank)

Zoom on... Progress and perspectives for Sustainable Public Procurement in Georgia (UNEP)

- New provisions on sustainability and social criteria have recently been added to Georgia's national Law on public procurement (enter into force in Jan 2025)
- Various **practical documents** were developed, i.e. sustainability criteria and technical specifications for selected products, guidelines, training and communication materials
- Benefits of SPP were promoted among stakeholders through awareness campaigns
