Case study: Legislation on SPP improved

- **Law of Georgia on Public Procurement 09/02/2023** (enters into force in 2025)

Article 2. Principles of public procurement

Article 12. General rights & duties of PP participants

Article 53. Procurement conditions

“Achievement of the goal of sustainable development shall be mandatory while implementing public procurement”

- **Decree of the Government of Georgia on SPP**

Defines the (CPV) codes of the procurement object (goods, services, work), during the procurement of which it is obligatory to take into account the sustainability aspects



Case study: Tenders with SPP and energy-efficiency criteria reviewed

Analysis of use of sustainability criteria in PP conducted by state organizations:

- Analysis of 250 tenders announced by the state contracting organizations in 2018-2022
- About 35% of reviewed tenders included SPP criteria
e.g. adaptation of transport for PwDs, fuel efficiency, energy efficiency, operational costs, emission standards, social requirements, durability, etc.
- Cases of successful tenders with SPP criteria

SPP reforms and practices in Georgia
New PP legislation - key pillar for SPP development

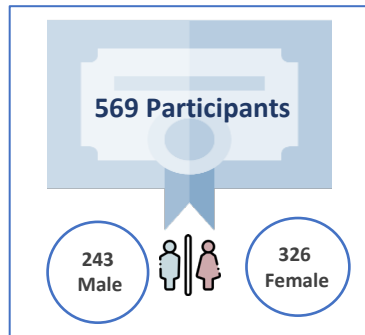

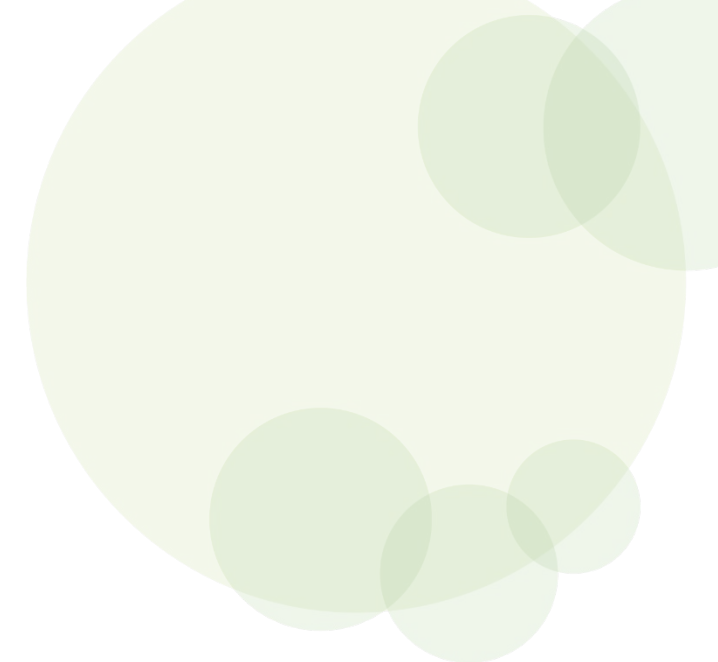
