Closing Remarks

Event objectives, expected outputs, and outcomes

The national conference in the Republic of Moldova will highlight and promote resilience and green growth among Moldovan enterprises by showcasing the benefits of Resource Efficient and Cleaner Production (RECP) in the transition to a

green economy. Additionally, the event will provide an opportunity to share experiences on implementing the RECP methodology in Small and Medium Sized Enterprises (SMEs), providing examples of eco-innovation in target sectors (wine making, construction, and textile production) and present means to access support tools and services (both national and from the European Union). Additionally, the event will provide a platform discuss potential synergies and collaborations within other national and international initiatives, and advance the national policy on the green transition of SMEs.

The high-level discussion on the challenges and opportunities for green and circular economy introduction in the Republic of Moldova as drivers for competitiveness and sustainability, will focus on the EU legislation and Circular Economy Action Plan, as well as the EU support initiatives such as the EU LIFE Programme. This will be continued with the award ceremony dedicated to the SMEs and experts who took part in the EU4Environment demonstration activities in 2020-2023. The ceremony will be followed by a short media briefing and networking break to facilitate experience sharing between the SME representatives and local and national journalists.

The event will be then divided into seven sessions: the first session will focus on resource and energy efficiency, building on the RECP legacy in Moldova and the national policies and strategies needed to support a green transition. Here, discussions will also focus on the new draft Environmental Strategy for 2023-2030 and its contribution to achieving the European environmental objectives. It is recognized that one of the most directly relevant approaches to improve production and reduce waste within industries is the introduction of RECP. Concretely, the second session will delve into business-to-business cooperation and greening value chains with concrete examples from the RECP Demonstration Companies and Clubs members. These will further feed into the discussion of the third session, which will

reflect concrete resource efficiency examples from specific sectors. The fourth session will shift discussion into practical examples and underline greening strategies used by two Moldovan pilots where feasibility of Eco-Industrial parks application was assessed, Industrial Park Tracom and Free Economic Zone Valkaneş. Their experience will be supplemented by the awareness-raising experience of introducing the Product Environmental Footprint (PEF) methodology to Moldovan enterprises wishing to access the European Union Single Market for Green Products at the fifth session. This discussion will also be focused on eco-labelling and green public procurement practices experience in the country. Further, at the sixth session, the national and international partners will present their perspective on building supply chains for Circular Economy and investing in partnerships between municipalities and the private sector. Lastly, the seventh session will be future-oriented and present plans and opportunities to engage support and provide access to green finance in Moldova.

Participants

The target audience is comprised of stakeholders engaged in green economic development in Moldova (including Government agencies and relevant institutions), as well as representatives of industrial enterprises, businesses, experts in the fields of engineering and energy, members of academia, NGOs, and representatives of the SMEs taking part in different components of the EU4Environment Action. The tentative number of participants is about 60 persons.

The event is organized by the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO), as an implementing partner of the EU4Environment Action, and supported in Moldova by its National Implementing Partner, the Organization for the Development of Entrepreneurship (ODA). Background

Resource Efficient and Cleaner Production (RECP) is an umbrella term used for the application of preventative environmental strategies to processes, goods, and services to improve production and lower risks to people and the environment. The RECP methodology was developed by UNIDO to assist enterprises in identifying, evaluating, and reducing their resource usage while eradicating losses, increasing resilience, and enhancing productivity and competitiveness. In Moldova and other Eastern Partnership (EaP) countries, the UNIDO RECP methodology is introduced under the regional programme funded by the European Union, "EU4Environment" Action.

About EU4Environment

The EU4Environment Action aims to help the EU's Eastern Partnership countries preserve their natural capital and increase people's environmental well-being by supporting environment-related action, demonstrating and unlocking opportunities for greener growth, and setting mechanisms to better manage environmental risks and impacts. It is implemented by five partner organizations: OECD, UNECE, UNEP, UNIDO, and the World Bank over the 2019-2024 period, with a budget of EUR 20 million.
