#### **DEVELOPMENT OF ECO-LABELLING SYSTEM**

In 2020, with the support of the **EU4Environment** -Green Economy in Eastern Partner Countries regional project, the Republic of Moldova initiated the process of developing an eco-labelling system at the national level. With the support of the project, were developed:

Assessment of the eco-labelling system in the Republic of Moldova in line with EU requirements (for environmental goods/products and services);

**Roadmap** for the establishment of a national eco-labelling scheme through the implementation of EU Regulation (EC) No 66/2010;

**Guideline**: Ecolabelling Scheme in the Republic of Moldova;

The **Regulation on Eco-labelling** and supporting documents (Information Note, Table of Concordance, Regulatory Impact Assessment (RIA) ) for the promotion of the draft Regulation;







The **graphic** representation of the national logo for eco-labelling has been developed and registered by the State Agency for Intellectual Property.







## CASE STUDY: LEGISLATION ON ECO-LABELLING IMPROVED

- Government Decision No. 204/2023 approving the Ecolabel Regulation (*Published: 28.04.2023 in the OFFICIAL MONITOR No. 147-150 art. 326*)
- Next steps in developing the Eco-label system:
- • Approval of the Regulation on eco-label graphic and conditions of use;
- **Develop** the **national eco-labelling criteria** according to EU standards and approval in line with national procedures;
- Training workshops for the business community and competent authorities for eco-labelling;
- Including ecolabelling in all secondary legal provisions and policy documents.





# CASE STUDY: LINK BETWEEN ECOLABELLING AND SPP HIGHLIGHTED

- Setting environmental standards: The Ecolabel sets rules and criteria for labelling products as organic.
- Incorporating standards into public procurement: Public procurement explicitly requires products to meet environmental standards. Ecolabeling can be one criterion during PP.
- Encouraging competition between certified products: Competition between producers of eco-labelled products is encouraged as well the consumer's interest increases.
- Regular updating of labeling criteria: Organic standards are regularly reviewed to keep pace with technological progress.
- Implementation and compliance monitoring: Verification of compliance with environmental standards during and after purchase.
- Education and awareness: Informing and educating public authorities and suppliers about the benefits and importance of the eco-label. This will show how EU environmental standards (the eco-label) are integrated into the procurement process to promote sustainable and responsible procurement.
