Background

This workshop is organised under the EU4Environment Programme – Activity 4.1.2 "Supporting regional collaboration, information exchange and knowledge sharing in protecting biodiversity and natural ecosystems (the Emerald Network) in the Eastern Partnership (EaP) countries".

The EU4Environment Programme supports the EaP countries in advancing the Emerald Network by developing national action plans and roadmaps, legal framework recommendations, management plan guidelines, and pilot management plans. It also enhances scientific knowledge, builds management capacity, raises awareness, promotes regional collaboration, and facilitates knowledge exchange.

Objectives

The workshop aims to share knowledge, experiences and good practices in management and conservation of the Emerald Network. The event will focus on legal frameworks, site management, enforcement, capacity building, community participation, economic activities, and the experiences of EU countries and related initiatives such as the EU Biodiversity Strategy for 2030 and the Nature Restoration Law.

09:00-09:30	Travel to Devínska Kobyla
09:30-12:30	Visit to Devínska Kobyla Features xerothermic biotopes, forests, sand walls, and paleontological sites. The site hosts specific habitats with a high number of protected species. It is managed by NGOs and a local farmer under the guidance of public administration, with cooperation from local authorities, and demonstrates traditional management of xerothermic meadows, such as goat grazing. Examples of extensive forest management approaches and development of sustainable tourism will be provided.

14:20-14:40	Visit to Devínske rameno Devínske rameno (Devin branch) is part of the Natura 2000 site Bratislavské luhy typical by natural floodplain forests. The Devín branch was re-connected with the river after 70 years of isolation in 2015. The restoration done by the BROZ NGO aimed to ensure that the Devín branch flows along its entire length. At its inlet, the bottom was deepened by two meters and the 28-meter-long old bank fortification was removed. The applied measures contained removal of migration barriers for aquatic animals, creating suitable breeding grounds for fish and amphibians, removal of invasive plants and planting native trees.

14:50-15:10	Visit to Devínska hradná skala A small, scenic site renowned for its zoological, botanical, and geological significance. It can be visited if time allows or skipped if time is limited. Serves as an example of protecting a NATURA 2000 site located near a tourist hotspot—Devin Castle.

15:55-17:00	Visit to restored part of the Rudava river The Rudava river represents unique lowland river in Slovakia with natural channel, flowing in part of its course through sand dunes. Main part of the river is designed as Natura2000 site, Ramsar site and as protected area by national legislation. Protected is broad spectrum of habitats, including alder floodplain forests and natural river habitats. The restoration took place in channelized part of the river and it aimed in converting straight channel with bottom and banks fortified by concrete to meandering river. This type of restoration was applied here first time in Slovakia. After removal of fortification, meandering channel was excavated and where necessary, natural fortification of the banks was locally applied. The rest of channel formation was left for natural processes of the river. We will observe results.
