Emerald Network in Ukraine: From Designation to Effective Management

October 3, 2025 | 10:00-13:30 (EEST), online

Background

A capacity-building workshop to raise awareness of Ukraine's commitments under the Convention on the Conservation of European Wildlife and Natural Habitats (Bern Convention), focusing on the designation and management of Emerald sites for flora and fauna species and natural habitat conservation. The workshop will include:

- An overview of existing Emerald sites in Ukraine and comparable examples from other countries,
- Guidance on approaches to the preservation and restoration of species and habitats through effective Emerald site management in Ukraine and internationally.

This workshop is one of the nine capacity-building events organized as part of the World Bank-led activities under EU4Environment Program sub-component 4.1: Support to protect biodiversity and natural ecosystems (Emerald network). Activities under this sub-component aim to advance the establishment of the Emerald Network and management of the Emerald Sites in the Eastern Partner countries, including Ukraine.

Objectives

To raise decision-makers' and the public awareness of the requirements of the Convention on the Conservation of European Wildlife and Natural Habitats and the key resolutions guiding the designation and management of Emerald Network sites.

Organizers

The workshop is organised by the World Bank jointly with the international consulting company Particip GmbH and Rewilding Ukraine, implementing activities under sub-component 4.1.

Participants

Representatives of the Ministry of Economy, Environment and Agriculture, the State Forestry Agency, the State Water Agency, the State Fisheries Agency, the State Environmental Inspectorate, stakeholders of the three model Emerald sites, representatives of the Protected Areas' administration, the World Bank, EU Delegation to Ukraine, research and academic institutions, universities and higher schools, media, and civil society organisations.
